

Jasper Pattenden has today ended his three-year stay at Adams Park by agreeing a move to fellow Sky Bet League One side Stevenage.

The defender, aged 23, grabbed his opportunity in professional football after being scouted playing for Worthing, moving to the Blues in 2022 and earning his senior debut that August.

He went on to play 41 times in total for the club and also achieved the Community Player of the Year award in 2023/24 in recognition of his outstanding contributions at countless activities run by Wycombe Wanderers Foundation across the community.

Tom Stockwell, the club's Director of Football Strategy, said: "Jasper is someone who's highly respected not just in the changing room but across the whole club for his personality and work ethic.

"He leaves here with our best wishes and gratitude for everything he's done on and off the pitch."

Jasper said: "I've had so many happy memories here and met some unbelievable people. I made my first step into professional football here and it's a really special place, so I'm sad to leave but also excited to go on my next journey.

"The fans have been fantastic to me since the day I arrived. I feel like I had a special relationship with the fans and I never took their support for granted. They're the people that keep the club alive and make it tick, and they've me and my family feel so welcome."
