



Former Wycombe striker Matt McClure joins Chesham United

Former Wycombe Wanderers striker Matt McClure has joined Buckinghamshire neighbours Chesham United.

The 33-year-old, who scored 26 goals in 124 matches for the Chairboys between 2009 and 2015, signs for the Generals following his exit from Chippenham Town.

The Slough-born ex-Northern Ireland U21 forward left the Adams Park side following the conclusion of the 2014/15 season, with his lasting outing being against Plymouth Argyle in that year's League Two play-off semi-final second leg.

Wycombe would reach the final but narrowly missed out on promotion against Southend United, losing the Wembley showpiece on penalties.

McClure was an unused substitute that day.

He is also best known for having one of the quickest red cards in English football history.

The forward came on as a second-half substitute against Tranmere Rovers in March 2015, but was sent off 70 seconds after coming on.

In total, the ball had been in play for eight seconds when McClure caught Adam Dugdale with an elbow when going in for an aerial challenge.

He would leave Wanderers as a free agent for Dagenham & Redbridge for one season, before forging a career in the Non League.

He spent one season with the Daggers, who were in League Two, before having three successful seasons at Aldershot Town.

Ten goals in 22 matches in half a season for Maidstone United led him to sign for Gloucester City before a brief stint at Chippenham Town.

He joins Chesham 10 years after his exit from Wycombe.
