

Jack Grimmer says Marlow Road upgrades show the ambition of ownership group for the Chairboys.

Blues skipper made his return to the newly upgraded Marlow Road training ground with the rest of the squad on Monday and spoke of the clear intentions of the ownership group and their goals for the Chairboys.

Grimmer noted that the owners "are really giving us the best for what we need to hopefully push this club forward," in an interview conducted at the end of the squad's first day back at the newly renovated training ground.

"The pictures and that don't do it justice. Walking around the building and seeing all the small details that everyone has put in is just incredible.

"It's a real testament to, you know, the ownership group and just how much they've put into this training ground."

The Chairboys captain also claimed that "the club's moved such a long way in such a short space of time," and went further to confirm, "the ownership here are really putting in some substantial change into the actual infrastructure of the club which is, as a fan, I imagine very, very reassuring.

"You know, they're thinking about the long term, and I think they do need a huge amount of credit for that. I think as a fan it's probably a really exciting place to be at the moment."



Grimmer also spoke on the poignant gesture of the ownership group to name the pitches at the ground in honour of Adam Ankers, the young season ticket holder and Wycombe Wanderers Foundation player who tragically passed away last February, "To name the pitches after Adam, it's a touching thing, you know for a lad that was playing in the academy for the Foundation, and wanted to be in the first team. I think it's a touching sentiment that keeps him, and rightly so, as never forgotten.

"I think that it's long after us that we'll all be away from this place and [Adam Ankers] will still remain, and the plaque will still remain. I think, when I heard it was quite touching and a great thing, and I think it's what Wycombe's been built on, is the people and that's a real touching thing from the owners to do."



With the start of pre-season preparation underway and the first of the friendlies in sight, Grimmer touched on the squad getting back into routine at their new training home, "you come in [Marlow Road] today, and immediately everyone wants to raise their performance."

"The first training session today at Marlow Road was brilliant because the pitches are incredible, you know, they match the infrastructure that's been built here which makes everything so much smoother and easier for us [...] it's good to be back at what I see as our home and to hit the ground running."
