



Huddersfield Town Website Match Report

- Wycombe Wanderers 3-0 Huddersfield Town; Sky Bet League One
- Terriers suffer defeat at Adams Park
- 871 Town supporters make trip to Buckinghamshire

Huddersfield Town suffered a 3-0 defeat away at Wycombe Wanderers, as goals from Macauley Woodrow, Fred Onyedinma, and an own goal, meant that the Chairboys took away all three points from the Sky Bet League One fixture.

Town's first chance of the game came through a dead ball, struck beautifully by Leo Castledine. The Chelsea loan clipped a 27-yard free-kick over the Wycombe wall, with it dipping towards the top corner, but the ball flashed narrowly wide of the target — not far away!

Unfortunately for the Terriers, 25 minutes into the first half, Alfie May was shown an immediate red card for his late challenge on Wycombe winger Fred Onyedinma. The Town forward was visibly frustrated with his tackle, and as he left the field he held his hands up, apologising to the travelling Town supporters.

A few minutes later, Town goalkeeper Lee Nicholls produced an incredible save on his 150th appearance for the Club. With the Chairboys attempting to take advantage of their one-man advantage, Cauley Woodrow chipped a ball into the area, with Sam Bell lurking at the back post. The Wycombe forward directed the ball towards goal, but Nicholls was there to tip the ball over the bar.

Leo Castledine was forced off the field with an injury in the 37th minute, with the forward being replaced by Joe Taylor. One minute later, Wycombe found the first goal of the game. Daniel Harvie did well to push the ball beyond Wiles on the left flank, before delivering a deflected cross into the box. Ruben Roosken was unable to make strong contact with the ball, sending it towards Woodrow, who nodded in from close range.

Nicholls made another few superb stops in the first 15 minutes of the second half. The pick of the bunch was the Town keeper diving full-stretch to his left to push away Alex Lowry's right-footed bending effort, diverting the ball out for a corner.

Lee Grant changed his shape going into the final half an hour of play. Sean Roughan was introduced off the bench, seeing the Terriers switch into a 3-1-4-1 formation, with Ryan Ledson playing behind Ben Wiles, and Lynden Gooch in the midfield, and Joe Taylor leading the line.

As the game entered the final stages, Michael Duff's side found their second goal. Onyedinma had been causing trouble throughout the second half, and as he collected the ball on the edge of the area, he cut back inside onto his left foot and beyond Gooch, and then cracked a left-footed shot into the bottom corner.

The Chairboys made it three in the final ten minutes, when young Dan Vost unluckily redirected a Wycombe cross into his own net.
