



Wycombe Wanderers are pleased to announce the signing of their tenth new recruit of the summer as goalkeeper Stuart Moore joins the club ahead of the 2025/26 campaign, which kicks off at Bradford City on Saturday.

The 30-year-old arrives to strengthen the first-team goalkeeping department and work with Mikki van Sas and Will Norris, having gained experience across the EFL throughout his career, most recently with Morecambe last season.

A Reading academy graduate, Stuart embarked on various loan spells before moving to Barrow, Swindon and then MK Dons, where he featured against the Blues in an EFL Trophy tie in 2019.

He has since represented Wealdstone and Blackpool ahead of his spell with the Shrimps last term.



Head Coach Mike Dodds commented: "Stuart's a great person to bring into the club to work with our other first-team goalkeepers and make sure we've got the right depth in that department for the season ahead.

"He's picked up really good experience at various clubs and we're pleased he's agreed to join us and be part of what we're building here."

Tom Stockwell, the club's Director of Football Strategy and Data Intelligence, added: "With Shamal George going out on loan, it left us short of a goalkeeper in the squad, and Stuart is the perfect profile to fill the role.

"He's very experienced across the levels within the English game and he will provide a challenge and support to Will and Mikki. He's a top professional and positive character, and we are sure Stu will be a strong addition to the group."
