

Reading were denied a first League One win of the season in an entertaining 2-2 draw with near-neighbours Wycombe Wanderers.

The Chairboys, who are also still winless, took an early lead through Fred Onyedima but the Royals lead at the break after quickfire goals from Mamadi Camara and Lewis Wing.

Much the better side in the second half, substitute James Tilley struck an 88th-minute suckerpunch to draw a second away match in three days at Adams Park.

In a fast start, both sides looked up for the occasion and put on an entertaining spectacle for both sets of supporters- including nearly 2,000 from Reading.

Somewhat against the run of play the hosts took the lead in the 10th minute. Looking comfortable on the halfway line, Fin Burns lost out to Dan Udoh and the forward cut it back for Onyedinma to side-foot home his first goal of 2025. Taking a bit of a hit, the Chairboys grew into the tie and looked to take advantage of a shaky spell for the Royals.

Midfielder Luke Leahy came close as he volleyed wide from the edge of the box while Joel Pereira was forced into a big save as Onyedima was sent through over the defence. Despite the chances falling the way of the hosts, it was a far from poor performance from Reading, who just lacked the final ball into the attacking third to test the defence.

That did not last though, and Reading were knocking on the door as half-time approached. Charlie Savage forced Mikki Van Sas into a low save, as did Mark O'Mahony from a deft header. As it looked like Mike Dodds' side might take a lead into the break, Wing's cross to the back post found Camara, who beat Jack Grimmer and headed into the net to draw level.

The celebrations among the near-2,000 strong away-end had hardly curtailed while Van Sas and his defence got into a mix up and Wing fizzed home against his former side to send the travelling supporters from agony to ecstasy in the space of two second-half minutes.

Reading began the second half how they ended the first, on top and looking threatening. Full of confidence, while their hosts appeared to have very little, the Royals enjoyed playing it around on the Adams Park pitch and impressively maintained wave after wave of attack. It could have been an even larger lead on the hour-mark, O'Mahony clattering an effort off the crossbar after taking Wing's pass down on his chest.

The Chairboys, as one would expect, pushed hard for the equaliser and certainly made Reading fans swear behind the goal. Both Taylor Allen and Udoh forced Joel Pereira into smart saves. Magnus Westergaard should have levelled the scores late on as a deep free-kick fell to the substitute in the middle of the penalty box, but he could only find the top row of the WhiffAway Stand behind the goal.

As it looked like they had done enough to escape with the three points, Kelvin Abrefa was beaten on the right and Allen's cross was converted by Tilley at the back post to snatch a dramatic point at the death.

Both sides had chances to win the exchange in an open period of stoppage time, but a point apiece ensures both sides remaining winless
