



League One Wycombe sack head coach Dodds



League One strugglers Wycombe Wanderers have sacked head coach Mike Dodds.

The 39-year-old oversaw five defeats and just one win from eight league games this season.

Wycombe had been second in the table when former Sunderland coach Dodds replaced Matt Bloomfield, after he left Adams Park for the Luton Town job in January.

He managed to take the Chairboys to the League One play-offs with a fifth-placed finish, but were beaten 1-0 on aggregate in the semi-finals by Charlton Athletic - who would go on to seal promotion.

In his seven months in charge, Dodds led Wycombe to only nine wins in 31 games across all competitions.

In a short statement about Dodds' exit on <u>the club website</u>, <u>external</u> the departure of first-team coach Peter Shuttleworth was also confirmed.

"The board has reluctantly taken this decision, and the club would like to place on record its gratitude to Mike and Pete for their hard work and efforts during their time with Wycombe Wanderers, and wish them every success for the future," the club said.

The slow start to the season under the former Sunderland assistant has Wycombe 19th in the table and equal on points with Reading, who are in the relegation places.
