



Garath McCleary's time at Wycombe Wanderers has come to an end with the forward leaving the club by mutual consent.

The 38-year-old arrived at Adams Park in the Chairboys' Championship season in November 2020 and went on to contribute 31 goals and 28 assists in 219 appearances, sitting joint 14th in the club's list of appearances makers in the EFL era.

A firm fans' favourite and integral member of the squad throughout his Wycombe career, Garath will now be able to pursue new opportunities as a free agent after the transfer window closes on Monday.
